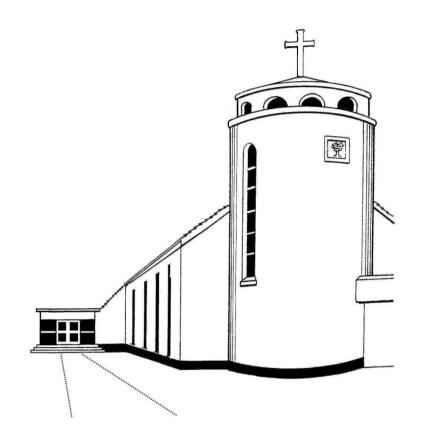

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

#### **Governing Document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution

#### **Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees**

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts, Christian maturity and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. The Congregational Board consists of eight elders appointed by the Kirk Session and a further eight members elected from within the congregation. These are people who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the Church. Board Members are elected at the Stated Annual Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they may seek re-election.

#### **Organisational Structure**

The Congregational Board is chaired by the minister and meets up to eight times in a year. In the autumn of the year, the Board improved its administration by forming Finance and Property Committees, and though it has not proved possible to appoint a Property Convener, the Committee is working well. The Kirk Session, which meets up to nine times a year, is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church; the Kirk Session now has three committees whose responsibility is to discuss and initiate matters within their remit, after approval if appropriate by the full Kirk Session. Their remits cover Mission, Pastoral Care and Worship. Members of the congregation are invited to be involved in these committees according to their interest

Together with the congregations of St David's Broomhouse, St Nicholas Sighthill and Stenhouse St Aidan's the congregation was in process of forming a parish grouping; however Stenhouse St Aidan's has now withdrawn from the arrangement

#### **Objectives and Activities**

Slateford Longstone is part of the Church of Scotland, which is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in governance. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

**Services:** these are held weekly on Sunday mornings, with Communion celebrated on the first Sunday of each month. Monthly evening services, known as Café Church, are held jointly with the other congregations in the area. Other services are held from time to time, particularly during the Christmas and Easter seasons, including a series of joint services in Holy Week.

Children's and Youth Work: Creche (0-3 years) Sunday School (3-10 years) and Lazer Group (10 years upwards) operate most Sundays during the year. There is a full range of uniformed organisations which have a "sponsorship" relationship with the congregation — Rainbows, Brownies (2 packs) and Guides, plus a Scout Group consisting of Beavers, Cubs and Scouts. Special services for these organisations are held at Christmas, Easter and Harvest. An annual summer holiday club for children of primary school age is held

**Spiritual Growth:** Several Cluster Groups meet in a variety of locations for discussion and fellowship. There is a monthly Prayer Meeting, and a Food and Faith group for men. A *Start!* Course has been established for those enquiring about the faith. Other groups include a branch of The Guild and an Over 50s Group. Choir practices are held most weeks.

Community Service: The Friday Coffee Morning had to close its doors during 2009 because of the decline in numbers attending. The halls are however made available at reasonable cost to a wide range of community groups, including Alcoholics Anonymous, a Mother and Toddler group, and the Lighthouse Chapel, whose attenders are mainly of Ghanaian origin. Members of our congregation deliver Christmas greeting cards from the congregation around the parish, and invitations to the summer holiday club. We also organise an annual Shoebox Appeal on behalf of Samaritan's Purse, collecting shoeboxes filled with useful gifts for transport to needy places; this initiative is widely supported in the community.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

**Worship:** Use of Church Hymnary Fourth Edition is now well-established, with praise led not only on the organ but also a piano & guitar combination. The audio-visual system is used not only to project the words of hymns but also for various images and film clips. The Café Church events continue, and in our case are held in the church, where the a-v system and the facility to arrange the seating in café style is of great benefit. Other special services include a Memorial Carol Service specially for families bereaved during the year. During Holy Week, the church was laid out labyrinth-style, to enable people to make a prayerful walk through the events of Christ's Passion

**Membership:** During the year, five new members were admitted by profession of faith, the largest group for many years. Together with the addition of a few others joining Slateford Longstone from other congregations, this meant that the year ended with a drop in membership of just one, to 270

**Office-Bearers:** During the year, the previous Treasurer resigned her post. The Board appointed James Byers, Presbytery Treasurer, in the interim, and was pleased to appoint Elizabeth Chalmers, a member of the congregation as Treasurer from November onwards. Mr Byers continued to act as assistant.

**Developments:** Highlights during the year included the **Showstoppers Holiday Club**, which attracted 40 -50 children for five days in early August, continuing the increase from previous years. Some of the men who attend **Food and Faith** events formed a Cluster Group for further study and reflection. During the Spring, a stewardship initiative was undertaken, branded as **Together We Make a Difference.** Two congregational meals were held, at which the challenges of stewardship were presented. To date there has been a small but above inflation increase in offerings. In a completely new development, the church **website** went live in June and can be found at <a href="https://www.slatefordlongstone.org.uk">www.slatefordlongstone.org.uk</a>. The purposes of the website are to help people looking for a church to find out about us, to provide information for members, and to offer a forum for discussion. The site has proved more popular with visitors than anticipated, with about 2,500 – 4,000 page impressions (individual visits to different web pages) every month

**Parish Grouping:** Progress towards the formation of this grouping received a jolt during the year, with the withdrawal of Stenhouse St Aidan's, and the steering group sought guidance from Edinburgh Presbytery as to the best way forward

#### **Property**

During the year, a major repair was carried out on a large flat roof section over the suite of halls, at a cost of some £15,000. This sum was met from a combination of a grant from Edinburgh Presbytery, reserves, and generous donations from members and friends of the congregation. This was the second major roof repair in recent years, the previous one being on the roof of the church itself. In 2009, a refurbishment of the vestry was started, thanks to a substantial donation in memory of a deceased member of the congregation

#### **Financial Review**

As reported in the revised 2008 report, funds had been misappropriated during a period starting in 2006 to June 2009. As at 31 December 2008 the sums misappropriated amounted to £22,347, further sums were misappropriated in the six months to June 2009 and the total stood at £33,528. Thereafter, £9,900 was repaid and £23,628 was outstanding at 31 December 2009.

As at 1, January 2009 the Charity had an excess of liabilities over assets of £15,273. The Presbytery of Edinburgh made allowances to the congregation and consequently the shortfall in assets was extinguished. Unrestricted Reserves at 31 December 2009 amounted to £2,033.

Despite the dismay caused by these events, congregational offerings are increasing, which together with the good financial controls now in place, lead the trustees to be confident about the future.

#### **Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities**

In common with all charities the trustees recognise their responsibility to prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the charity during the year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- Make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operational existence.
- to keep proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the charity at any time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.
- be responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

As reported in the revised 2008 Report, there was clearly a failure in responsibility brought about by over-reliance on the integrity of one of the trustees.

In terms of their responsibilities the trustees:

- appointed Mr James Byers, F.C.A. as Interim Treasurer, and commissioned him to conduct a forensic examination of the accounts
- informed the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator about the misappropriation of funds
- acted upon legal advice on the best way to resolve the matter and minimise financial loss, including informing the police, who initiated an investigation
- improved the systems for induction and training of trustees
- appointed Mr Allan Sim BSc CA, of the firm of Johnston Smillie Ltd, Chartered Accountants, as the independent Examiner
- changed systems of internal control to help ensure this situation does not arise in the future
- appointed members to a Finance Committee, which will monitor financial matters, with assistance from Presbytery

#### Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Slateford Longstone Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2009 which are set out on pages 8 to 19.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

#### Independent examiner's statement

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention other than disclosed above

- 1. which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements:
  - to keep accounting records in accordance with Section 44(1) (a) of the 2005 Act and Regulation 4 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations, and
  - to prepare accounts which accord with the accounting records and comply with Regulation 9 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations have not been met, or
- to which, in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding

  internal control.

#### 1. Accounting policies

- a. The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006, the Regulations anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (2005).
- b. Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts, income tax recovered under Gift-Aid and legacies. This income is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by members, adherents and volunteers has not been included.
- c. Resources expended are recognised to the particular activity where the cost is related directly to that activity, and when that cost is incurred.
- d. The church is recognised as a charity for the purpose of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its activities. The Church is not registered for V.A.T. and resources expended therefore include irrecoverable input V.A.T.
- e. The Church including Halls and the Manse, are vested in the Church of Scotland General Trustees. The value of these heritable properties are therefore not recorded in the Accounts.

- h. Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.
- i. Restricted funds are to be used for the purposes laid down by the Congregational Board.

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £22,239 and the maximum stipend (after 10years) £29,526.

#### 24. Misappropriated Funds

The financial review included in the Trustees' Report contains details of charitable funds misappropriated in the period from June 2006 to June 2009.

One of the consequences of this misappropriation was that at 1 January 2009, the congregation was £41,346 in arrears in Ministry and Mission contributions to the Church of Scotland . The Presbytery of Edinburgh made allowance to the congregation and consequently this liability was extinguished. The sum has been treated as Other Incoming Resources.

The funds misappropriated and not repaid amounted to £23,628 as at 31 December 2009. This amount has been written off under Other Outgoing Resources. Any future recoveries of this sum will be paid to the Presbytery of Edinburgh in recognition of the allowance referred to above.
